

### Monthly Team Meetings

Barriers when accessing healthcare and supports, including

- Check in: how are we doing? Emotional, Physical,
   Mental, Spiritual. Getting grounded.
- Issues arising from our work: what is happening to the women we are supporting? Are there Gaps?
- What do **WE** need in order to do this work well?
- Support and Learn from each other; Team maintenance & planning; mutual support & humour

## Peer Support Work: what do we do?

Peers meet positive women in their homes, in healthcare and other community settings, helping them to:

\* most their daily peeds (food security income support

- \* meet their daily needs (food security, income support, housing, immigration hearings, interpretation)
- \* pursue health seeking and other beneficial activities: appointments, medical tests, advocacy & more

- How to write a research or evaluation application

- Identify research question(s)
- Align methods with research question
- Research Ethics and participant experience
- Implementing recommendations to program & KTE
- Apply for & Receive funding

## Potential research questions

#### For clients:

- Is life becoming easier?
- Are clients engaging more in community?
- Do they experience less HIV stigma?
- Are they more engaged in HIV care?

#### For peer workers:

- Supports needed while working?
- Is HIV stigma reduced?
- Are labour market attachments built or strengthened?

- Engaged, healthy and successful community members, pursuing career goals and their dreams
- Communities become safer places to live, work and play
- Employment and learning opportunities
- Building career skills
